MEMORANDUM FOR THE CHAIRMAN, LONDON SIGNAL INTELLIGENCE BOARD:

SUBJECT: [] Communications Security.

REFERENCE: Letter of 10 December 1951 from the Chairman, LSIB to the Chairman, USCIB (LSIB/224/51).

1. On 11 January 1952 the President approved the report of the U.S.-U.K. Conference on the Security of [] Communications.

2. USCIB has considered the reference letter and makes the following observations:

a. It was agreed at the U.S.-U.K. Conference that an improvement in the general security of the [] Government must be prerequisite to effective correction of the insecurity of [] communications.

b. [] security. That report is an examination of present security conditions and a catalog of standards and procedures which, if approved and implemented, might produce the necessary improvement in general [] security.

c. It is the understanding of USCIB that an approach to [] menting action on the basis of its approval.

3. Following these developments USCIB will, as previously agreed, be prepared to discuss the means for approaching the [] [] along the general lines recommended in the reference letter.
