This agreement made this twentieth day of March, 1943
between Boris Caesar Wilhelm Hagelin of Greenwich, in the county of Fairfield
in the state of Connecticut, a subject of the King of Sweden, party of the
first part, and the United States of America, party of the second part,

WITNESSETH:

That, WHEREAS, an application for United States letters patent for a
Teletype Cipherring device Serial No. 286,286 filed by Boris Caesar Wilhelm
Hagelin, and

WHEREAS the said Boris Caesar Wilhelm Hagelin is the owner of the entire
right and title to said application, and

WHEREAS the said application has been held secret under an order of
secrecy dated February 22, 1943, and

WHEREAS the United States is desirous of obtaining certain legal rights
thereunder;

Now, THEREFORE, in consideration of the surrounding circumstances the
parties have agreed as follows:

The said Boris Caesar Wilhelm Hagelin hereby grants a royalty-free non-
exclusive license to the party of the second part to manufacture, use and sell
the machine disclosed in the said application for United States patent.
This license shall be in effect during hostilities with any country with
which the United States is now at war and for six months thereafter, but it
shall cover the completion of all contracts executed before the termination of
hostilities.

The said Boris Caesar Wilhelm Hagelin hereby waives any claim which he
may have arising from the holding of the said application secret in the United
States Patent Office.
