2074/2 - Encl "A" Para 3 (p. 21):

"3 In the event of an emergency occurring before the availability of a new Combined cipher machine, the U.S. Chiefs of Staff wish to assure the British Chiefs of Staff that they will endeavor to provide the U.K., if necessary, with a limited number of cipher machines of adequate security then available from U.S. stock to meet the immediate urgent needs of highest Command Combined Communications."

2074/5 - Encl "B" Para. 7e (p. 43):

"e. The U.S. has already agreed that, if necessary, we will provide the British with a limited number of adequately-secure cipher machines (from U.S. stocks) to meet an emergency situation which might arise before 1 January 1955 when the replacement CCM is to be available. Which U.S. machine this will be depends upon the then-existing circumstances, (emphasis supplied)"
