1. I telephonically contacted Mr. Friedman on 20 May to inquire if he would stop by my office sometime during the day of 21 May while he was at the Operations Building to attend the NSASAB meeting. Mr. Friedman inquired as to the reason for the visit and I informed him it was to discuss the documents which he had given me before he left for Mexico.
2. I advised Mr. Friedman that these documents had been considered by the Classification Advisory Panel and some of them had been classified CONFIDENTIAL. He stated that his health is not good at this time and he has no intention of doing any work on the documents. He requested that we retain the documents and should he ever have need for them he would contact the Agency. I told Mr. Friedman we would do this and also advised him that I had a letter addressed to him which I would give to him on 21 May. I did give him the letter on that date. If he has any questions regarding the contents of the letter, he will contact me.
3. The documents have been returned to the AG who will maintain control of them. It appears that there is no further action necessary on this matter at this time.
