USCIB: 13.5/56.      Item 5 of the Agenda for the 102nd Meeting of USCIB, held on 9 April 1954.

Subject:              The Anderson Case (13.5/53).

THE ACTING CHAIRMAN (Lt. General Cabell) requested the Executive Secretary to make an oral report concerning the Anderson case so that the members might be informed of its present status.

CAPTAIN TAYLOR reviewed the background of the Anderson case. He reported that the FBI has interviewed Anderson's mother and learned that he has returned to the U.S. He explained that the Executive Committee has considered this problem and has agreed that it would be desirable to interview Anderson on a frank and friendly basis. Accordingly, the Army has agreed to send a representative of ASA to conduct the interview. He went on to say that a letter has been sent to Anderson by ASA advising that Colonel Schwieker would be in the area on other business and asking Anderson if he would care to discuss his experiences. Captain Taylor then referred the Board to USCIB 13.5/53, dated 7 April 1954, which outlines the method of handling and information desired.

GENERAL REICHELDERFER advised that the Army had confined the purpose stated in their letter to a discussion of Anderson's experiences with ASA(E).

DECISION: (9 April 1954) USCIB, after receiving an oral report from the Executive Secretary on the Anderson case, approved the method of handling and manner in which the interview is to be conducted.
